#### Directions

Navigate focus crosshair over the subject and acquire focus before shooting. Check that there is no motion blur captured in the frame. You can improve many compositions by placing an interesting object close to the camera. Try to shoot at advantageous times of day, such as sunrise and sunset, to get the best shadows and color. In order to achieve both the appropriate aperture and a fast enough shutter speed to hand-hold the image, use the RAW exposure technique and don't be afraid to raise the ISO if needed.



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## exposing action

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We think about crisp action in terms of fast shutter speed. But with automotive photography, if we shoot too fast, we cannot tell if the car is moving.

> Sony A7R4 Sony 70-200 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/80 F/6.3

We think about crisp action in terms of fast shutter speed. But with automotive photography, if we shoot too fast, we cannot tell if the car is moving.

> Sony A9 70-200 f/2.8 ISO 1000 1/2500 F/3.2



Instead a shutter speed around 1/200 is just about perfect. I have shot even slower when panning with the subject. 🍃

> Sony A7R4 Sony 70-200 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/200 F/8

We will be working at close distance, which creates a naturally shallower depth of field, but depending on where you stand, the proximity of the background might mitigate that factor.

> Sony A7R4 Sony 16-35 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/400 F/6.3

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That said, to get as much of the car in focus as possible, it may be prudent to stop down to around f/ 8.

> Sony A7R4 Sony 70-200 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/200 F/10

But we may still find that we need to increase ISO values, especially if the track is shaded due to weather.

When dealing with action we are more concerned with an appropriately exposed subject than with the totality of the Scene.

You will want to be in AF-C focusing mode. You can be successful in following the action with or without tracking.

> Sony A7R4 Sony 16-35 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/200 F/9



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But if you have tracking it will identify the subject and stick with it throughout the movement.

> Sony A7R4 Sony 70-200 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/200 F/9

Panning is a different trick altogether. We track the subject in the same way as before.

> Sony A7R4 Sony 16-35 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/200 F/9

However we slow down our shutter speed and follow the car, keeping it in the same part of the frame. This way the background blurs more than the subject.

> Sony A9 70-200 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/80 F/6.3

This usually means a shutter speed between 1/80 and 1/200 and either a stopped down aperture or a neutral density filter.

> Sony A7R4 Sony 16-35 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/100 F/14





## Here. Car show

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Here we will be shooting lower to the ground and much wider.

> Sony A7R4 Sony 16-35 f/2.8 ISO 100 1/100 F/9
